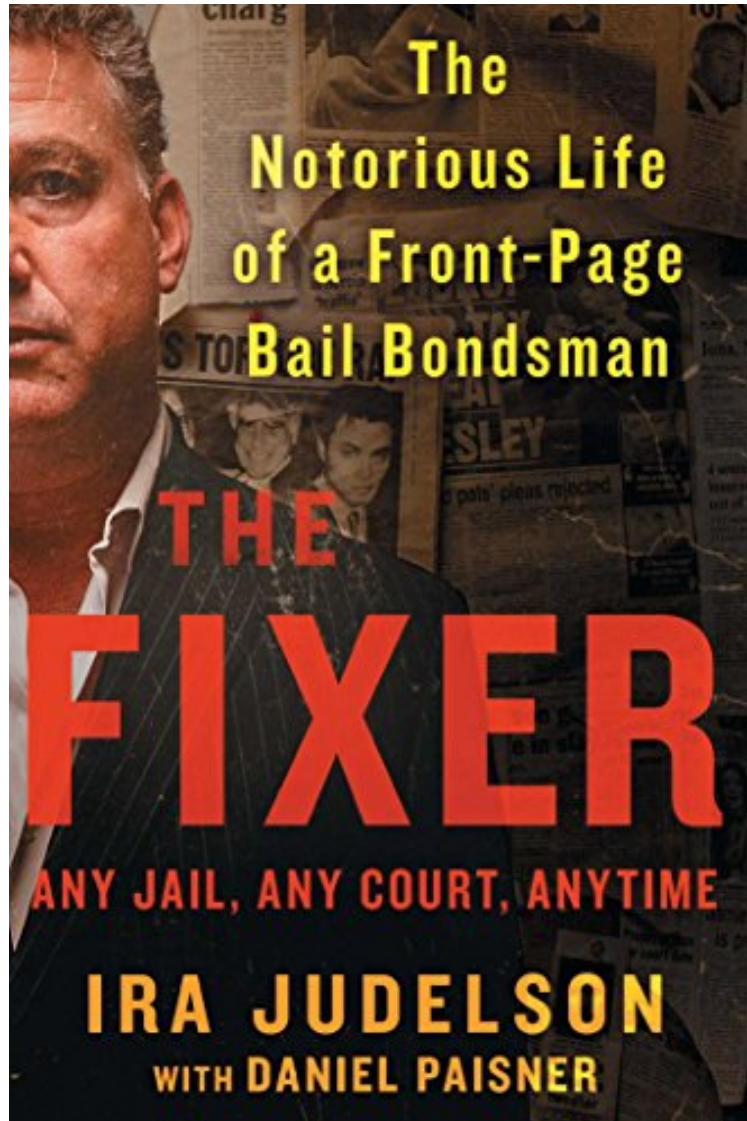

His focus is himself: the directionless kid who fell into a job as a bondsman (due to a family connection and a rather blink-worthy coincidence) and turned it into a thriving, exciting, sometimes dangerous career.
