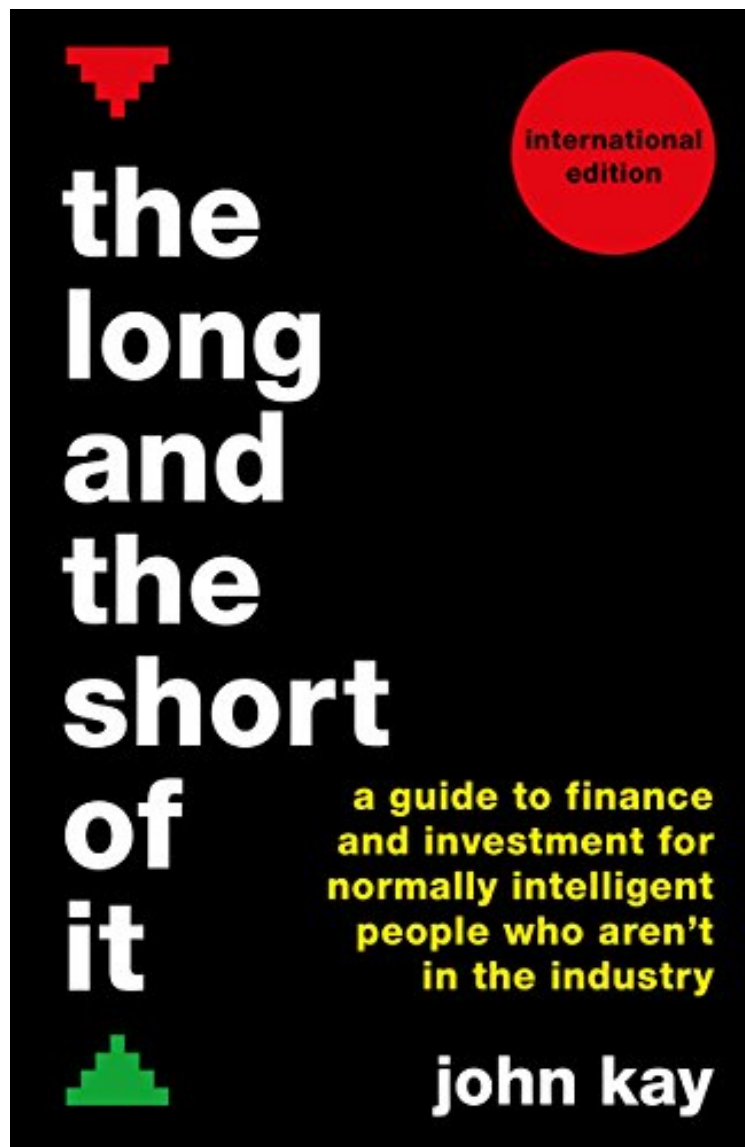

I especially appreciated the in-depth way the Author covers two important trading strategies available to investors: Trend and Mean Reversion. The first strategy seeks to exploit momentum, buy into market rises, sell ahead of market falls. The alternative approach focuses attention on fundamental value and anticipates that, in the long run, fundamentals will assert themselves thru mean reversion.
