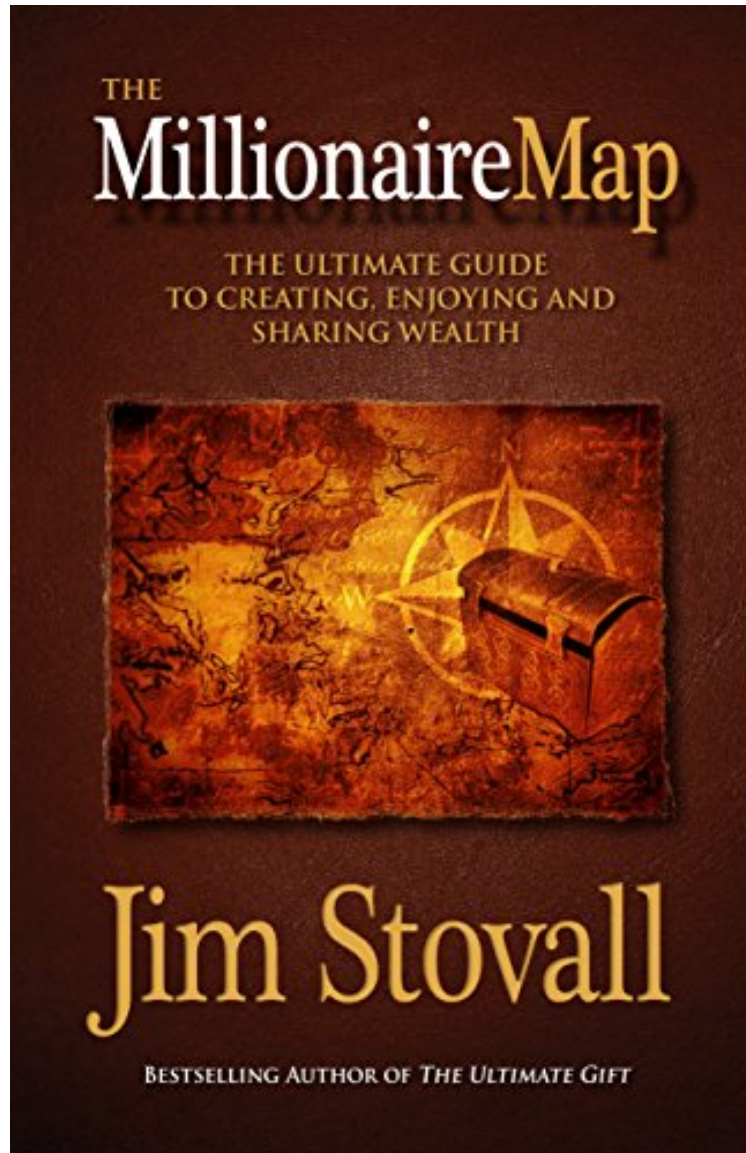

provided elsewhere or not, but that part was conspicuously absent from the Kindle version and "Book Extras" was grayed out. I never did find his map. It was really about his life, with an overabundance of unnecessary millionaire name-dropping, minus the details that would have made this a much better value and use of time. Not to say it's a totally worthless read. The author offered a few juicy bits for those who know very little about accumulating wealth, but I felt "The Richest Man In Babylon" does it far better. My eyes glazed over at the autobiographical stories, which I ended up skipping after the one about their green car. The autobiographical parts could have been edited for brevity without losing any of his message. The "meat" would have fit in less than a third of the page count, had they held the "potatoes." There was a lot missing for this to be called an "Ultimate Guide," particularly with all of the proclamations about how much the author's purpose lies in helping others to help themselves further along. For example, the author suggests finding professionals to support your mission to millionaire status who are already millionaires themselves, yet he doesn't bother to share any names or referrals. He could have listed them with a disclaimer, releasing himself from any responsibility for any outcomes, of course, and certainly that would have been better than nothing. I fully expected him to list relevant organizations, or, at the very least and ESPECIALLY, that list of books that his first mentor had him read. What was the point of referring to them over and over, yet refraining from naming so much as one single book?? That really irritated me. Then there was the "exclusive" code to the link that should "help you narrow down your entrepreneurial search." Maybe he gave the wrong link? The link offered only answered whether one should consider becoming an entrepreneur, and nothing more. Two very different things, and a question I did not need answered. I couldn't help but laugh about his repeatedly advising to be sure to find someone who is a millionaire to invest our money with and not trust anyone who isn't, yet he invested \$4,000 when he started out and says that the person he chose was not a millionaire then either. Good point, but really? Where are the tips on how to find such a person then? Beyond these flaws, the book did offer 4 or 5 very solid points, unfortunately nothing I hadn't read/learned before or haven't already put into practice. If nothing else, I guess it lent a modicum of reassurance that I'm on the right track. ^\_^ ... not;\_not;I can't say I'd recommend this book though. If you know absolutely nothing about building wealth, then I would recommend you read The Richest Man in Babylon instead.

The title is misleading. This is more of a story of how he became rich, which is very inspiring considering that he was a sportsman and then became blind but did not give up on his dreams. He found a way to overcome his disability (blindness) and achieve success. Some takeaways are learn to save your money early on (I know our parents told the same things but it is hard to practice that), get a mentor who already been where you want to be, push your limits (I am a sportsman too not as big as Jim was but I can see how he got the habit of pushing one's limits), assess your current state and visualize your goal and then build a map, create a product or service that is of great use to people and continue to be in demand, enjoy the journey and the ups and downs of your millionaire journey etc. etc. All in all very inspiring story and a good read.
